A veterans' relief fund of such amount as may be included in the budget may be expended to provide the necessities of life for such Maryland veterans of the world wars or any other war, or the widows and infant children of veterans as are sick, disabled or indigent, and who are without means to pay for said necessities or for proper care, and for the purpose of providing the necessary funeral expenses of such veterans, WHO WERE INDIGENT AT THE TIME OF THEIR DEATH, to the person who assumes responsibilities for the burial of said veteran and who requests such payment, which in no case shall be less than one hundred dollars (\$100.00). Such veterans' relief shall be distributed to such persons of the above classes and in such amounts as the Commission provided for in Section 3 of this article shall deem proper.

The administrative expenses of the Commission, including salaries, shall be provided for in the budget.

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted*, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1966.

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CHAPTER 453

(House Bill 607)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 695 of Article 43 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1965 Replacement Volume), title "Health," subtitle "Air Pollution," to specify the duties of the Air Pollution Control Council.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That Section 695 of Article 43 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1965 Replacement Volume), title "Health," subtitle "Air Pollution," be and it is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

695.

The Council [is hereby authorized to] shall

(1) Formulate and recommend to the Board rules and regulations for the control of air pollution. [only at the request of the Board or the Commissioner of the Department.]

(2) Recommend to the Board the amendment or repeal of any rule or regulation where amendment or repeal, in the opinion of the Council, is in the best interest of the State.

(3) Review the policies and program of the Board with respect to air pollution.

(4) Consult with and advise the Board on matters relating to air pollution.

(5) Hold hearings as herein provided.
