Senate Bill No. 527—Workmen's Compensation for Firefighters

AN ACT to add new Section ~~103~~ 64A to Article 101 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1970 Supplement), title "Workmen's Compensation," SUBTITLE "MISCELLANEOUS," to follow immediately after Section ~~102~~ 64 thereof and to be under the new subtitle "~~Death and Disability Payments—Fire Fighters,~~" to establish certain medical conditions where the death or disability of a fire fighter is presumed to be ~~accidental and as a result of his employment.~~ COMPENSABLE UNDER THIS ARTICLE AND CONCERNING RETIREMENT BENEFITS FOR DISABLED FIRE FIGHTERS.

Dear Mr. President:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17, of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 527.

This bill provides that where impairment of a firefighter's health is caused by certain enumerated diseases, such impairment is presumed to be compensable under the workmen's compensation laws.

House Bill 433, which was enacted by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 24, 1971, accomplished the same purpose as
