State of Maryland to the aforesaid retirement system of the amounts required to meet the current disbursements for such additional pensions.

- (4) The additional pensions provided herein shall be provided for the employees of municipal corporations upon the approval of the legislative body of any such municipal corporation participating in the Employees' Retirement System.
- (5) Any member of the system who made additional voluntary contributions under Section 14(1)(e) of this article may withdraw the additional amount of contributions with interest, provided that refund is requested within one year after July 1, 1963.
- (6) The provisions of subsection (3)(e) herein apply to members who retired prior to June 30, 1962, as well as to those who retire after that date.
- SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1972.

CHAPTER 735

(Senate Bill 612)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 691 of Article 43 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1971 Replacement Volume), title "Health," subtitle "Air Quality Control," amending the term "air pollution" in the Air Quality Control Act in order to provide that, unless a definite health hazard is concerned, the term does not include certain airborne fluff resulting from the drying, loading, or unloading of corn grain, being sometimes known and referred to as bees' wings.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Section 691 of Article 43 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1971 Replacement Volume), title "Health," subtitle "Air Quality Control," be and it is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

691.

For the purposes of this subtitle:

(a) The term "air pollution" shall mean the presence in the outdoor atmosphere of substances in quantities, having characteristics and being of a duration which, from any single source or in combination with other sources, are, or may be predicted with reasonable certainty to be injurious to human, plant or animal life or to property, or which unreasonably interfere with the proper enjoyment of the property of others by reason of the emission of odors, solids, vapors, liquids or gases, throughout the State and in such areas of the State as are affected thereby. *Unless a definite health hazard is concerned, the term "air pollution" does not include*
