(b) In addition to the salary provided in this section each commissioner shall be allowed his [actual] necessary traveling and incidental expenses IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE STANDARD TRAVEL REGULATIONS, as provided in the annual State budget.

(a) There is hereby created as part of the Department of Personnel an agency of the State to be known as the "commissioners of the State Accident Fund," to be composed of five commissioners appointed by the Secretary of Personnel, subject to the approval of the Governor, with the powers and duties hereinafter prescribed. The commissioners shall be selected from among the employers, employees or other citizens of the State, as the Secretary of Personnel and the Governor may determine. Appointments shall be for terms of five years each. Each commissioner shall hold office until his successor shall be appointed and shall have qualified. Vacancies shall be filled by the Secretary of Personnel, with the approval of the Governor, for the unexpired term. Said commissioners shall elect annually a chairman, vice-chairman and secretary. The concurrence of at least three commissioners shall be necessary in all matters. Said commissioners shall operate and administer the State Accident Fund and shall devote as much of their time thereto as may be necessary to perform the duties incumbent upon them and carry out the functions of the State Accident Fund. The commissioners shall be paid semimonthly such salaries as are provided in the budget. In addition thereto they shall be entitled to their [actual and] necessary traveling expenses, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE STANDARD TRAVEL REGULATIONS, while engaged in transacting the business of the State Accident Fund, including those incurred in attending meetings of the commissioners.

SECTION 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 6 of Chapter 448 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1892, be and it is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:
