Baynard, Clerk of the Circuit Court for Talbot County, Maryland, by taking the oath prescribed by law, and did elect Earle B. Wood Chairman of the Board of Canvassers, and Linda O. H. Sharp Secretary of the said Board.

The Board of Canvassers of Elections aforesaid upon being duly organized as aforesaid did open all the original statements, returns and tally sheets delivered or transmitted to them and did canvass and add up the votes and make abstracts and statements thereof of the votes cast at the Election held on Tuesday, November 13, 1973, in said County in the several districts and precincts thereof, and we do hereby certify and state that the whole number of votes cast in said County for and against Constitutional Amendments and Referred Laws, were as follows:
