

serve at the pleasure of the Board and shall receive [the same compensation as the Board] A ~~\$50~~ \$40 PER DIEM FOR EACH DAY NECESSARILY AND ACTUALLY ENGAGED IN THE PERFORMANCE OF THEIR DUTIES AND REIMBURSEMENT FOR REASONABLE EXPENSES INCURRED IN PERFORMANCE OF OFFICIAL DUTIES, ALL AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act may not be construed to extend or apply to the per diem allowance for the members of the Barbers Board in office on the effective date of this Act, but the provisions of this Act concerning this allowance shall take effect at the beginning of the next following term of office.

SECTION 2 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1978.

AN ACT concerning

Statute of Limitations - Welfare Fraud

FOR the purpose of altering the statute of limitations for welfare fraud; and presenting certain provisions relating to the crime of welfare fraud.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That section(s) of the Annotated Code of Maryland be repealed, amended, or enacted to read as follows:

Article - Courts and Judicial Proceedings
