

MEMORIAL.

To the Honorable,

The Senate Maryland:

THE Memorial of the undersigned, citizens of Somerset county, respectfully represents, that at the election held on the eighth day of November last, a large number of votes were placed in the ballot box for a certain Levin L. Waters, as Senator for said county, who was declared elected to said office; that at the same time a large number of votes were cast for Samuel A. Graham for the same office.

Your memorialists further represent, that said Levin L. Waters is not entitled to hold any office of profit, trust or honor under the laws of this State, in that he has given aid, comfort, countenance and support to those engaged in armed hostility to the United States, that he has advised a certain person or persons to enter the service of the enemies of the United States, and aided such person or persons so to enter; that he has by open deed and word declared his adhesion to the cause of the enemies of the United States, and his desire for the triumph of said enemies over the armies of the United States.

Wherefore, your memorialists pray that the said Levin L. Waters may be declared ineligible to hold the said office of Senator for Somerset county; that the said Samuel A. Graham may be declared entitled to said office, or that the same may be declared vacant as in your judgment may seem lawful and right.
