To His Excellency, the Governor of Maryland:

WHEREAS, an election for a Senator of Maryland for Somerset county, was held on the first Tuesday next after the first Monday of November, in the year eighteen hundred and sixty-four, in election districts distinguished by numbers one, two, three, four, five, six, seven, eight, nine, ten, eleven, twelve, thirteen, fourteen and fifteen, in Somerset county, in the State of Maryland, conformably to the Constitution and Laws of this State; *and whereas*, we the subscribers, attending Judges, at the close of the election in said districts in said county, having this day assembled at the usual place of the sitting of the Circuit Court for said county with the books of the Polls, on which are endorsed the several certificates agreeably to law, and having cast up the whole number of votes given in said districts, according to the certificates made out on the day of election by the Judges, it appears that Levin L. Waters has the greatest number of legal votes for Senator of Maryland; whereupon we do determine, declare and return, that the said Levin L. Waters is duly elected; we further certify that the oath prescribed by the Constitution of the State was administered to each person who cast a ballot in said county at said election.
