4. He shall, at least once in every twenty-four hours, visit

each station-house, and observe its condition.

5. Upon the occurrence of any extensive conflagration or serious riot or tumultuous assemblage, he shall repair to the spot, and if the Marshal be not present, take charge of the Police Force, and act as the Marshal is required to do. When the Marshal is on the ground, the Deputy will remain and assist him, or repair to the Office or elsewhere as the Marshal may direct.

## CAPTAINS.

- 1. The Captains of Police will be held strictly accountable for the preservation of the public peace in their several districts; and to insure good order, they are invested with the power to post the men under their command in such parts of their respective districts, and assign to them such duties as they may deem expedient; subject at all times, however, to the orders of the Marshal or Deputy Marshal. Captains will also be responsible for the condition of their several station houses.
- 2. They will exercise constant vigilance over all supicious houses and places in their respective districts, and command their Policemen to carefully note the residence, within their beats, and the conduct of all suspicious persons. The Captains will keep a record of the same, and report the result to the Marshal from time to time, as he may direct.

They shall report to the Marshal in writing all violations of the prescribed rules and regulations, by any of their

command, that may come to their knowledge.

- 4. They shall on the first day of every month, (and at any other times when necessary,) make out, and return to the Marshal, requisitions for supplies of all such articles as the Board of Police may authorize to be furnished for the use of the station-houses, and shall at the same time report the quantities of each article remaining on hand of supplies previously furnished. They will on the 1st days of May, August, November, and February, in each year, and also whenever at other times specially called on, return to the Marshal an accurate inventory of all furniture and property in, and will state the condition of, their respective station-houses.
- 5. They will be held responsible for the cleanliness of their respective station-houses; and will permit no persons to remain about them but members of the Police Force, or other parties who may have business requiring their presence there.
- 6. The Captain, or Officer at the time in command at each station-house, will keep a Policeman or Turnkey constantly stationed at the door, who shall refuse admittance to persons not connected with the Police Force, unless their visit is on
