- merely holds meetings <u>OR PROVIDES SUPPORT SERVICES</u> to help individuals who show the effects of alcohol abuse or alcoholism;
- [(4)] (3) An employees' assistance program of a business entity; or
 - [(5)] (4) The American Council on Alcoholism, Inc.
- (c) [The Department shall adopt rules and regulations that set standards for certification of alcohol abuse facilities.] UNLESS CERTIFICATION IS REQUESTED, THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO THE FOLLOWING FACILITIES:
- (1) A HOSPITAL ACCREDITED BY THE JOINT COMMISSION ON ACCREDITATION OF HOSPITALS AND DEFINED IN § 19-301 OF THIS ARTICLE; AND
- (2) AN ALCOHOLISM TREATMENT PROGRAM ACCREDITED BY THE JOINT COMMISSION ON ACCREDITATION OF HOSPITALS.
- (D) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS FOR ESTABLISHING, OPERATING, AND CERTIFYING ALCOHOL ABUSE FACILITIES, INCLUDING STANDARDS RELATING TO:
- (1) ALCOHOLISM TREATMENT AND REHABILITATION SERVICES;
- (2) ENVIRONMENTAL AND SAFETY REQUIREMENTS CONCERNING PHYSICAL PLANT, EQUIPMENT, AND STRUCTURE.
- (E) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ISSUE A CERTIFICATE TO AN ALCOHOL ABUSE FACILITY THAT MEETS THE CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS UNDER THIS SECTION.
- (F) EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN THIS SECTION, AN ALCOHOL ABUSE FACILITY MUST BE CERTIFIED BY THE DEPARTMENT BEFORE THE FACILITY MAY OPERATE IN THIS STATE.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1986.
