- (A) ANY PENALTY IMPOSED UNDER THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO AN INDIVIDUAL WHO KILLS OR WOUNDS A BLACK BEAR IN DEFENSE OF THE INDIVIDUAL'S OWN LIFE, THE LIVES OF OTHER INDIVIDUALS, OR THE LIVES OF ANIMALS ON THE INDIVIDUAL'S PROPERTY.
- (B) IF THE SECRETARY ADOPTS ANY REGULATION, INCLUDING AN EMERGENCY REGULATION, UNDER § 10-205 OR § 10-405 OF THIS TITLE TO PROHIBIT THE HUNTING, POSSESSING, SELLING, PURCHASING, SHIPPING, CARRYING, TRANSPORTING, OR EXPORTING OF BLACK BEARS, A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THE REGULATION IS SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING PENALTIES:
- (1) FOR A FIRST OFFENSE, A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$5,000 \$1,500, IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 6 MONTHS, OR BOTH AND SUSPENSION OF THE PERSON'S HUNTING LICENSE AND RIGHT TO HUNT ANY BIRD OR GAME ANIMAL FOR A PERIOD OF TIME NOT EXCEEDING 2 YEARS; AND
- (2) FOR A SECOND OR SUBSEQUENT OFFENSE, A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$5,000, imprisonment not exceeding 1 year, or both and suspension of the person's hunting license and right to hunt any bird or game animal for a period of time not exceeding 4 years.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1986.
