A House Joint Resolution concerning

Improvement of the Woodrow Wilson Bridge

FOR the purpose of requesting the Maryland Department of Transportation to work with its counterparts in Virginia, the District of Columbia, and the appropriate federal agencies in widening and improving the Woodrow Wilson Bridge.

WHEREAS, The Woodrow Wilson Bridge was constructed in 1961 to handle 75,000 vehicles daily; however, by 1986 over 115,000 vehicles were using the Wilson Bridge daily; and

WHEREAS, The number of vehicles using the Wilson Bridge is expected to continue to increase due to dramatic population growth and enhanced employment opportunities in Prince George's, Charles, Prince William and Fairfax counties, and that by the year 2010 over 100,000 more vehicles than the number for which the bridge was originally designed will be crossing the bridge each day; and
