

(d) A striped bass stamp shall be attached to the holder's Chesapeake Bay sport fishing license or consolidated senior sport fishing license. The striped bass stamp shall expire at the same time as the license to which it is attached.

(e) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (a) of this section, a person who employs a fishing guide licensed under § 4-210 of this title may not be required to obtain a striped bass stamp in order to possess striped bass taken while employing the fishing guide during a striped bass season. A fishing guide shall obtain nonreusable striped bass tags from the Department IF REQUIRED, and shall reimburse the Department for the cost of the tags.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1993.

AN ACT concerning

Rechargeable Batteries

FOR the purpose of requiring certain rechargeable batteries, cells, and rechargeable products sold after a certain date by certain persons to certain users to be covered by certain unit management programs; requiring certain rechargeable batteries contained in certain products manufactured after a certain date to be easily removed, with certain exceptions; requiring certain units or associated materials to contain certain information after a certain date; prohibiting certain entities from enacting certain additional labeling requirements; requiring certain persons to
