SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Family Law

5-585.1.

(A) THERE IS A TASK FORCE ON THE COMPENSATION OF CHILD CARE PROVIDERS.

(B) THE TASK FORCE SHALL BE COMPOSED OF:

(1) ONE MEMBER OF THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, APPOINTED BY THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE;

(2) ONE MEMBER OF THE SENATE OF MARYLAND, APPOINTED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE; AND

(3) 21 MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR, AS FOLLOWS:

(~~3~~) (I) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE OF CHILDREN, YOUTH, AND FAMILIES, APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR;

(~~4~~) (II) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE, APPOINTED BY THE SECRETARY OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE;

(~~5~~) (III) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES, APPOINTED BY THE SECRETARY OF HUMAN RESOURCES WHO SHALL HAVE THE ABILITY TO EVALUATE THE FISCAL IMPACT ON THE STATE BUDGET AND STATE PROGRAMS OF THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE TASK FORCE;

(~~6~~) (IV) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE CHILD CARE ADMINISTRATION, APPOINTED BY THE SECRETARY OF HUMAN RESOURCES;

(~~7~~) (V) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC AND EMPLOYMENT DEVELOPMENT, APPOINTED BY THE SECRETARY OF ECONOMIC AND EMPLOYMENT DEVELOPMENT;
