## CHAPTER 496

(Senate Bill 528)

## AN ACT concerning

## Educational Staff at State Institutions and Vocational Rehabilitation Programs

FOR the purpose of requiring the Governor to include, commencing with fiscal year 1996 and every year thereafter, in the budget proposal submitted to the General Assembly the moneys necessary to fully fund a certain pay plan; requiring the Secretary of Personnel to make an annual adjustment to a certain pay plan; requiring an annual review of certain salaries by the Institutional Educator Pay Plan Committee; requiring the Secretary of Personnel to make adjustments to a certain pay plan for a certain year; altering the fiscal years for which the Secretary is required, under certain circumstances, to make adjustments to the pay plan; and generally relating to funding for the salaries of certain persons employed at certain State institutions and in certain vocational rehabilitation programs.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article - Education

6-303.

- (a) An individual who is employed as a teacher, librarian, principal, director of education, or supervisor of vocational education on the staffs of the following institutions or in the following programs, or an individual who is employed as a central office director, superintendent, specialist, or coordinator of education for the following institutions or programs, shall be paid the annual salary determined under subsection: (b) of this section:
  - (1)Any institution that is under the jurisdiction of:
    - (i) The Department of Juvenile Services; or
    - The Department of Health and Mental Hygiene;
- (2) Any vocational rehabilitation program operated by the Department of Education; and
- (3) Any correctional education program operated by the State Department of Education in a facility of the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services.
