Legislative Resolution No. 1–83

Resolution and Ordinance of the Town of University Park, Maryland, adopted pursuant to the authority of Article XI–E of the Constitution of Maryland and Sections 12 and 12 of Article 23A of the Annotated Code of Maryland to amend Article IV, entitled “Powers of Mayor and Common Council”, Section 401(b), subtitle “Appointments” by repealing and re–enacting Section 401(b) to provide that the Police Chief shall serve at the pleasure of the Mayor and Common Council.
