The condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bounden Samuel Webb, shall well and truly execute the office of Constable of Pienna in all things appertaining thereto, shall also well and truly account for all moneys placed in his hands for collection, and shall also well and truly pay all sums of money received by him, then the obligation to be void: otherwise of full force and virtue in law.
