Sundry Negroes } Maryland, Dorchester County, To Wit:

To all whom it may concern, be it known that I, Mary Ann Drain, of the Town of Cambridge, in Dorchester County and State of Maryland, for divers good Causes & Considerations, me therunto moving, have released from slavery, liberated, manumitted and set free, and by these presents do hereby release from slavery, liberate, manumit and set free, the following Negro Slaves, according to and the terms hereinafter specified, at which time or terms, they will each be able to work and gain a sufficient livelihood and maintenance, to wit: Negro Boy George aged four ten years, to be free January the first Eighteen hundred and sixty two, 1862 - Negro Boy, James Wise, aged three years, to be free January the first Eighteen hundred and sixty four, 1864. And Negro Girl Margant, aged seven years, to be free January the first Eighteen hundred and seventy, And thus the said Negroes George, James Wise and Margant I do declare to be free after the periods within named, and therewith free, manumitted and discharged from all manner of service, or servitudes to me, my Executors or Administrators forever - In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my name and seal affixed June 16<sup>th</sup> 1846.
