The Condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bounden William Kirwan shall well and truly execute the office of Constable, in Election District number five, in Dorchester County, in all things appertaining thereto, and shall well and truly account for all monies placed in his hands for Collection, and shall also well and truly pay all sums of Money raised by him, then the above obligation to be void, otherwise of full force and virtue in law.
