Know all men by these presents that I Thomas James Pattison, of Dorchester County in the State of Maryland, for divers good causes me therunto moving, have released from slavery, liberated, manumitted and set free, and by these presents do hereby release from slavery, liberate, manumit and set free, my Negro Man Sinkins Miller, (after serving John E. Stevens the term of fifteen years from the twentieth day of May Eighteen hundred and forty six) and him, the said Sinkins Miller, I do declare to be free, after serving as aforesaid, and discharged from all manner of services or servitudes to me, my Executors or administrators forever. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty fourth day of July Eighteen hundred and forty seven.
