the said Negro Girl is to be free and forever thereafter I do hereby manumit and set free
the said Puffilla McDaniel. It is an express Condition upon which the said Servant girl
is now sold that under no Circumstances is she to be sold for the term of Service aforesaid
or any portion thereof by the said Thomas W. Anderson or his heirs Executors administrators or
Assigns beyond the limits of the State of Maryland In Witness Whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and affixed my Seal this twenty first day of December in the year of our
Lord one thousand Eight Hundred and forty Eight.

his Exor. Adm. or assigns against me and against every other person or persons whomsoever. In
