Meekins her heirs and assigns forever a negro girl named Francis. To Have and To Hold the above mentioned negro girl Francis unto the said Mary E. Meekins her heirs and assigns to the only proper use and benefit and behoof of the said Mary E. Meekins her heirs and assigns forever. Witness my hand and Seal this eighteenth day of January Eighteen Hundred and forty nine.
