 from all manner of service or servitude to me, my executors or ad-
 ministrators forever. In Witness whereof I have here to set my name
 and seal affixed this 23^d August 1847.

Maryland, Dorchester County, S. C. On the 23^d
 day of August Anno Domini 1847, Then came James Jones J. P.
 before me the undersigned, a Justice of the Peace, in and for said
 County, and acknowledged the foregoing Manumission to be his act
 and deed, according to the purport, true intent and meaning of the
 same, and the Acts of Assembly in such case made & provided.

 Frazier, of Dorchester County in the State of Maryland,

 from Slavery, liberated, manumitted and forever set free, and by these presents
 do release from Slavery, liberate, manumit and forever set free my Negro
 Man called Henry Henson, aged about thirty four years, hereby acknowledging
 the said Negro Man called Henry Henson discharged & liberated from
 all manner of servitude from me, my heirs, executors and administrators,
 from and after the execution of this Manumission. Witness my hand
 and seal this 30th day of August 1847.
