Cornwell shall well and truly execute the Office of Constable, in the Town of Vienna in Dorchester County, in all things appertaining thereto, and shall well & truly account for all monies placed in his hands for collection, and shall also well & truly pay all sums of money received by him, then the above Obligations to be void, otherwise of full force & virtue in law.
