Andrews his wife of Dorchester County & State of Maryland, for & in consideration of the sum of Eighty dollars, current money of Maryland, to us in hand paid by Mary S. Hooper of the same County and State, before the en- sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said Sworn Mister and Fanny Mister his wife, William Andrews and Harriet J. Andrews his wife, have granted, bargained & sold, conveyed and transferred, and by these pre- sents do grant, bargain & sell, convey and transfer unto the said Mary S. Hooper, her heirs and assigns forever, all of our right and interest in and to the following Negroes, To Wit: one Negro woman, Nelly Hesthett, aged fifty three years, one Negro Man Charles Brown aged twenty four years, slaves for life, and now in the possession of the said Mary S. Hooper. To have and to hold all of our right to the above named Negroes to the said Mary S. Hooper, her heirs and assigns forever and to and for no other use, intent or purpose whatsoever, against us the said Sworn Mister and Fanny Mister his wife, and William Andrews and Harriet J. Andrews his wife, and our heirs, and against all persons whatever lawfully claim- ing the same or any part thereof by, from or under us
