 and other instruments of writing to aid in paying the debts of the State
 and shall well and faithfully pay into the Treasury of the State all
 sums of money which he may receive by virtue thereof at the
 periods therein limited for that purpose, then the above obligation
 to be void and of none effect or else to remain in full force and
 virtue in Law.

 said mare and one yearling of four unto the said James Wheller his executors and admi-
 nistrator or assigns, against me the said William Hubbard, my executor and
 administrator and against all and any other person or persons what-
 soever shall and will warrant, avow or defend by these presents of all
