 Laird, of Dorchester County in the state of Maryland, for divers  
 good causes and considerations one thence unto moving, have released from slavery, liberated,  
 manumitted and set free, and by these presents do hereby release from slavery, liberate,  
 manumit and set free, my Negro Girl named Martha Ellen Parker, being of the age  
 of eight years, and able to work and gain a sufficient livelihood and maintained,  
 and her the said Negro Girl named Martha Ellen Parker, I do declare to be hence-  
 forth free, manumitted and discharged from all manner of service or servitude, to  
 me, my Executors or Administrators, forever. In witness whereof I have here-  
 unto set my hand and seal this seventeenth day of January, in the year of Our  
 Lord eighteen hundred and forty eight.

 December Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and forty seven, Viz., one Negro  
 Girl named Elizabeth, aged about sixteen years and of a dark chestnut colour.

On this twentieth day of January, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and forty  
 eight, before the subscriber, a Justice of the Peace, in and for the County & state aforesaid,  
 personally appears William Hollow, of the County and State aforesaid, and made Oath  
 on the Holy Evangel of Almighty God, the above and aforesaid list of a Negro Girl  
 Elizabeth, as aforesaid therein, is just and true, and a full list of the negroes brought  
 by him, this defendant, from Sussex County, Delaware, into Dorchester County  
 Maryland, and that he has not removed said Negro Girl into this state  
 for the purpose of sale, and that she is a slave for life, and also that it  
 is his intention, still as here tofore, to be a citizen and resident of the County
