Wilkinson of said County, at and before the execution of these presents, the receipt whereof I the said William Henry do hereby acknowledge, have granted, bargained, sold, conveyed and transferred, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, convey and transfer unto the said Samuel J. Wilkinson, his heirs and assigns forever, the following property, to wit: one Spotted Stallion called Buephalus, otherwise called the Grand Turk, and which said Horse is now in my possession. To have and to hold the said above named Horse unto the said Samuel J. Wilkinson, his heirs and assigns forever, to his & their sole use and use forever, and to and for no other use, intent or purpose whatsoever, against me the said William Henry and my heirs, and against all persons whatsoever claiming or to claim the same.

Provided Never the less, and it is the true intent & meaning of these presents and of the said parties hereunto, that if the said parties hereunto that if the said William Henry his heirs or assigns do and shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said Samuel J. Wilkinson, his heirs or assigns the full and just sum of ninety nine dollars and ninety nine cents, current money of Maryland, with interest, within four months from the date thereof, then and in such case these presents and every matter and thing herein contained shall cease and become utterly null and void, any thing herein contained to the contrary notwithstanding. And the said William Henry doth further agree that if default shall be made in the payment of the said sum of ninety nine dollars and ninety nine cents, current money of Maryland, with interest from date, that then and in such case the said property herein conveyed shall become the property of the said Samuel
