(f) At the earliest practical date but no later than November 1 of each year, the Department shall provide the proposed consolidated transportation program and the proposed Maryland transportation plan to the [Office] DEPARTMENT of Planning for review and comment on planning issues including consistency between transportation investments and the State Economic Growth, Resource Protection, and Planning Policy.

(b) The Advisory Council is composed of the following:

(b) The Administration shall cooperate with the planning agencies of the [Office] DEPARTMENT of Planning and any other State or federal agency concerned with transit plans.

(c) To provide a framework for regional participation in the planning process, the Administration may create technical committees concerned with planning and the collection and analyses of information to aid in the transportation planning process. On request of the Administration, the [Office] DEPARTMENT OF PLANNING may make appointments to these committees.
