REVISOR'S NOTE: This subsection is new language added as the standard introductory language to a definition section.

(B) FRESH PURSUIT.

"FRESH PURSUIT" INCLUDES:

- (1) FRESH PURSUIT AS DEFINED BY THE COMMON LAW; AND
- (2) PURSUIT WITHOUT UNREASONABLE DELAY, BUT NOT NECESSARILY INSTANT PURSUIT, OF A PERSON WHO:
 - (I) HAS COMMITTED OR IS REASONABLY SUSPECTED OF HAVING COMMITTED A FELONY; OR
 - (II) IS SUSPECTED OF HAVING COMMITTED A FELONY, ALTHOUGH A FELONY HAS NOT BEEN COMMITTED, IF THERE IS REASONABLE GROUND FOR BELIEVING THAT A FELONY HAS BEEN COMMITTED.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This subsection is new language derived without substantive change from former Art. 27, § 599.

In the introductory language of this subsection, the former phrases "as used in this subtitle" and "as used herein", which modified "fresh pursuit", are deleted as unnecessary in light of subsection (a) of this section.

In item (2)(ii) of this subsection, the former references to "supposed" felony and a felony that has not "actually" been committed are deleted as surplusage.

Defined term: "Person" § 1-101

(C) STATE.

"STATE" MEANS A STATE OF THE UNITED STATES OR THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This subsection is new language derived without substantive change from former Art. 27, § 598.

The word "means" is substituted for the former words "shall include" to distinguish this definition from the article-wide definition of the term "state" found in Title 1 of this article. Because the article-wide definition is a "means" definition, and is meant to be exhaustive and not illustrative, the definition for Part II of this subtitle also must be stated as a "means" definition in order for it to be exhaustive for purposes of Part II of this subtitle. In addition, to ensure that the definition is exhaustive, the reference to "a state of the United States" is added.

The former phrase "[f]or the purpose of this subtitle" is deleted in light of subsection (a) of this section.
