- (15) one representative of the Co-Occurring Disorders Workgroup of the National Council on Alcoholism and Drug Dependence, Inc. Maryland and Mental Health Association of Maryland;
 - (16) one representative from the Maryland Psychiatric Society;
 - (17) one representative from the Maryland Nurses Association; and
 - (18) one representative from the Maryland Hospital Association;
- (19) one representative from the Community Behavioral Health Association of Maryland;
- (20) one representative from the Maryland Legislative Council of Social Workers; and
 - (21) one representative from the Maryland Psychological Association;
- (22) one representative from the State's Public Academic Health Center; and
 - (18) (21) (23) two consumers.
- (c) The members of the Task Force shall elect the chairman and vice-chairman from among the Task Force's members.
- (d) The Mental Hygiene Administration and the Alcohol and Drug Abuse Administration shall provide staff for the Task Force.
 - (e) A member of the Task Force:
 - (1) may not receive compensation; but
- (2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.
 - (f) The Task Force shall:
- (1) identify and recommend creative ways to provide and deliver comprehensive, integrated, cost-effective services to the population with co-occurring mental <u>health</u> <u>illness</u> and substance abuse disorders;
- (2) identify and recommend various methods of funding services through private and public sources;
- (3) make recommendations regarding both short-term and long-term residential services for people with co-occurring disorders, including recommendations on the number of units needed and a timeline for providing residential services;
- (4) make recommendations regarding how the Mental Hygiene Administration and Alcohol and Drug Abuse Administration may implement cross-training for mental health illness and addiction counselors; and
