- (d) (1) All eligible public school employees shall:
  - (i) Be included in one of these units; and
  - (ii) Have the rights granted in this subtitle.
- (2) Except for an individual who is designated as management personnel or a confidential employee under this subtitle, each public school employee is eligible for membership in one of the negotiating units.
- SECTION 2. <u>AND</u> BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the organization for administrative and supervisory positions currently recognized under  $\S$  6–404 of the Education Article shall be deemed the designated representative for the unit created in  $\S$  6–404(c)(2) of the Education Article and shall be subject to the provisions of Subtitle 6 of the Education Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act may not be construed to modify, amend, or supercede the provisions of the Education Article relating to changes in representation for the unit.

SECTION 3. 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act may not be construed to confer rights arising from certification on noncertificated employees.

SECTION 4. 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2003.
