- (e) The Commission shall submit a <u>an interim</u> report of its <u>preliminary</u> findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, to the General Assembly by November 1, 2003 <u>December 15</u>, 2002.
- (f) The Commission shall submit a final report of its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, to the General Assembly by September 1, 2003.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2002.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.

## **CHAPTER 344**

(House Bill 7)

AN ACT concerning

## Education - Principal Training Pilot Program

FOR the purpose of establishing the Principal Training Pilot Program; requiring that the State Board of Education provide certain incentive funding under the Program to provide school principals with certain topics of instruction and training; establishing eligibility requirements for applicants; requiring applicants, as a condition for receiving incentive funding under the Program, to submit program certain proposals to the State Board that include certain information; requiring the State Board to approve or disapprove of a program an applicant's program plan plan; requiring a program a plan to have a certain number of minimum hours of training; providing for the maximum amount of incentive funding per principal; requiring program applicants to match certain funds for receiving certain incentive funds; limiting the Program to a certain number of principals in certain counties; requiring the State Board each county superintendent of schools to choose eertain counties and the three principals from those counties for participation in the Program; requiring the State Superintendent of Schools to choose certain principals under certain circumstances; providing for the termination of this Act; requiring the Governor to include funds in the State budget to implement the program Program; requiring the State Board to submit a certain report to certain committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date including certain information; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the Principal Training Pilot Program.
