## AN ACT concerning

# Task Force to Study the State's Retiree Health Insurance Liabilities

FOR the purpose of establishing a Task Force to Study the State's Retiree Health Insurance Liabilities; providing for the membership, chairman, duties, and staffing of the Task Force; requiring the Task Force to report to the Governor and the General Assembly on its findings; and generally relating to the establishment of a Task Force to Study the State's Retiree Health Insurance Liabilities.

#### Preamble

WHEREAS, Maryland, like the majority of states around the country, partially subsidizes the health insurance premiums for retired State employees, and currently funds this subsidy on a "pay-as-you-go" basis; and

WHEREAS, This subsidy will grow dramatically in the future due to the growing number of State retirees and the escalation in health care costs; and

WHEREAS, The unfunded liabilities associated with this subsidy are informally estimated at \$3 billion; and

WHEREAS, To address these growing costs a growing minority of states have begun to prefund these liabilities; and

WHEREAS, Maryland currently has a fully funded pension system; and

WHEREAS, It is important that plans be made to ensure adequate funding for the State's subsidy of retiree health insurance; now, therefore,

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That:

- (a) There is a Task Force to Study the State's Retiree Health Insurance Liabilities.
  - (b) The Task Force shall consist of the following members:
- (1) three members from the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of the House; and
- (2) three members from the Senate, appointed by the President of the Senate.
- (c) The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Delegates shall jointly designate the Chairman of the Task Force.
