(VII) ANY OTHER RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE WORKGROUP, INCLUDING LEGAL, REGULATORY, OR POLICY CHANGES.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the State Department of Education shall administer the version of the Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance System survey that incorporates the provisions of the Maryland Adolescent Survey and the Youth Tobacco Survey on or before the 2009-2010 school year.~~

SECTION ~~2~~ 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect ~~October~~ July 1, 2007. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of June 30, 2009, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, today I have vetoed House Bill 629 - *Prince George's County - Task Force on the Establishment of Vocational and Technical Education High School Academies PG 423-07.*
