Wilecox of Anne Arundel County in the State of Maryland for and in consideration of the love and affection, which I have and bear to my infant Brother, Bond Chaplain Wicks, and to my infant Sister, Kate Stewart Wicks, do hereby give grant, release and confirm unto the said Bond Chaplain Wicks and Kate Stewart Wicks, in equal shares, and in the event of the death of either, then to the survivor, all the right, title, property, claim interest and demand at Law or in Equity, which I now have or of which I may hereafter become possessed, to the following named negroes; slaves now belonging to my mother Jane C. Wicks, wife of Thomas W. Wicks, to wit; Joseph Campen, William Cornish, or Whistler, man Robert, woman Mary woman Maria, boy John Wesley, boy David and boy Peter, and I declare it to be the true intent and meaning of this instrument of writing to convey to my above named infant Brother and Sister all my interest present or future, in the above named slaves
