

REVISOR'S NOTE: This subsection is new language derived without substantive change from former Art. 95A, § 20(n)(2) through (10) and, except for the second sentence, the introductory language of that subsection.

In paragraphs (1), (3)(iii)1, (iv), and (vi) of this subsection, the word "compensation" is substituted for the former word "remuneration", to conform to terminology used throughout the revised articles of the Code.

In the introductory language of paragraph (3)(i) of this section, the word "classes" is deleted, as unnecessary in light of the word "class" and Art. 1, § 8 of the Code, which provides that generally the plural and singular are interchangeable.

As to the revision of former § 20 (n)(1), see § 8-607(b) of this title. Although former Art. 95A described the \$7,000 taxable wage base in the definition of the term "wage", the Labor and Employment Article Review Committee believed that, in many instances in which the defined term was used in the former law, the notion of the \$7,000 limitation was not applicable. Thus, former § 20(n)(1) is revised as a substantive provision that sets forth the limitation on the amount of wages on which an employing unit is required to make contributions.

GENERAL REVISOR'S NOTE TO SECTION :

The second sentence of former Art. 95A, § 1, which provided that the term "unemployment compensation" meant "unemployment insurance", is deleted as unnecessary since the term "unemployment insurance" is substituted for all former references to "unemployment compensation".

The third sentence of former Art. 95A, § 11(a)(1), which provided that the terms "Employment Security Board", "Department of Employment Security", and "Employment Security Administration" meant "Department of Economic and Employment Development", is deleted as unnecessary since the defined term "Department" or the term "Department of Economic and Employment Development" is substituted for all former references to "Employment Security Board", "Department of Employment Security", and "Employment Security Administration".
