

MARYLAND, Sct.:

At an Extraordinary Session of the General Assembly of Maryland, begun and held in the City of Annapolis on the Twenty-fifth Day of September, 1991, and Ending on the Twenty-second Day of October, 1991, William Donald Schaefer, being Governor of the State, the following laws were enacted, to wit:

CHAPTER 1

(Senate Bill 1)

AN ACT concerning

Prince George's County - School Board Districts

FOR the purpose of defining districts for electing representatives to the Prince George's County Board of Education; specifying certain election district and precinct boundaries; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally relating to the reconfiguration of school board districts in Prince George's County.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That Section(s) 3-801(a) through (j) of Article - Education of the Annotated Code of Maryland be repealed.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
