(a) [(1)] In this section [the following words have the meanings indicated.

(2) "Criminal], "CRIMINAL offense" does not include any violation of the Maryland Vehicle Law.

[(3) "Moving violation" means a moving violation as defined in regulations adopted by the Administration for the purpose of assessing points under § 16-402 of this article or a violation of a substantially similar nature reported from another jurisdiction, other than a violation of any of its size, weight, load, equipment, or inspection provisions.]

(a) The Administration may cancel a driver's license issued under this title if it determines that the licensee:

(1) Was not entitled to be issued the license;

(2) Failed to give the required or correct information in his application;
or

(3) Committed fraud in making the application or in obtaining the license.

(b) On cancellation, the licensee immediately shall surrender the canceled license to the Administration.

(a) (3) THE ADMINISTRATION MAY SUSPEND OR REVOKE A PROVISIONAL LICENSE UNDER § 16-213 OF THIS SUBTITLE.

(d) (1) After the Administration refuses to issue a license under this section [or after the Administration], determines that a suspension should be imposed under subsection (a)(2) of this section, OR DETERMINES THAT A SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION SHOULD BE IMPOSED UNDER SUBSECTION (A)(3) OF THIS SECTION, the Administration immediately shall give written notice to the applicant or licensee, and the applicant or licensee may request a hearing as provided in Title 12, Subtitle 2 of this article.

(2) Except as otherwise provided in this section, the Administration may suspend or revoke a license under this section only after a hearing under Title 12, Subtitle 2 of this article.

(3) If the Administration determines that there is a likelihood of substantial and immediate danger and harm to the licensee or others if the license is continued pending a hearing, the Administration:
