AN ACT to repeal and reenact with amendments the following: Table XIV: Design Requirements for Specific Uses LI Light Industrial District; and the following five tables: Table I: Principal Permitted Uses for Specific Zoning Districts Industrial (Part 1); Table I: Principal Permitted Uses for Specific Zoning Districts Industrial (Part 2); Table I: Principal Permitted Uses for Specific Zoning Districts Industrial (Part 3); Table I: Principal Permitted Uses for Specific Zoning Districts Industrial (Part 4); Table I: Principal Permitted Uses for Specific Zoning Districts Industrial (Part 5) to increase the height requirements and to decrease the front, side and rear yard requirements for certain uses in the LI District; to provide for additional permitted uses in the LI District; and generally relating to land development in the LI District.

AN ACT to repeal and reenact with amendments, Subsection C of Section 256-15, Fire Hydrants, and Subsection C of Section 256-19, Service, operation and maintenance charges, and to add new Subsections D, E and F to Section 256-20, Meters, of Article I, General Provisions, of Chapter 256, Water and Sewers, of the Harford County Code, as amended, to impose a charge of no more than \$300 for tampering with, defacing, damaging or otherwise obstructing a fire hydrant; to change the maximum fee for cessation or commencement of service from \$20 to \$50; to impose a fee of no more than \$100 for the unauthorized commencement of water service; to impose a fee of no more than \$300 for water meter tampering; to require that the Department be provided adequate access to County-owned meters located on private property; to authorize turning off water service if adequate access is not provided to County-owned meters on private property; to authorize a fee of no more than \$300 for the unauthorized use of a construction meter; and impose a fee of no more than \$100 for failure to appear for a quarterly reading of a construction meter.
