

(II) PROJECTED population[, and (3) other]; AND

(III) OTHER factors it deems desirable.

(4) In determining the apportionment for any year the committee may consider under-utilization of available funds and may transfer or advance unused allocations that have not been utilized within a given period. The committee may reallocate funds, subject however to the policy that over the [ten-year] 10-YEAR period any subdivision shall be allocated in the aggregate the funds it would have been entitled to receive if able to utilize them.

(5) Before adopting an apportionment formula and before allocating funds for any year, the committee shall notify the governing bodies of every affected subdivision of its intended action and, after reasonable notice, afford an opportunity for hearings on the apportionment or allocation.

(a) (5) (i) In accordance with the Department's regulations, upon receipt of evidence from the local governing body of a county or municipal corporation that funds have been spent on a project that is approved in the grant agreement, the Department shall cause the requested amount of funds from the local governing body's allocation to be reimbursed to the local governing body.

(ii) [1.] Any municipal corporation may submit evidence of expenditures for approved projects through its local governing body to the Department.

[2. For any municipal corporation that is located in more than one county within the Maryland-Washington Regional District, the local governing body referred to in this section means only the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission. Notwithstanding this requirement, § 5-911 of this subtitle controls in the case of a local project that is located in a municipal corporation that is located in more than one county within the Maryland-Washington Regional District.]
