

On motion by Mr. Maxcy, the words "to be equally divided between them," were inserted in the said clause, after the word "proceeds."

Mr. Hughes moved to strike out "five" after the words "rate of" to insert "three." Determined in the negative.

Mr. Barnes moved to strike out "three thousand dollars." Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Kennedy, the blank was filled up with "two thousand dollars."

On motion by Mr. Teackle, the following was added after the 2d section:

"Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That whenever the said commissioners shall have devised and determined upon any scheme or schemes of lotteries, before proceeding to the sale of any ticket or tickets, they shall form the same into books of fifty progressive numbers, and deposit the same, as a special deposit, in the branch bank of the United States in the city of Baltimore, or in some other bank in the said city, to be approved of, annually, by the governor and council; which books of tickets shall be checked for, or withdrawn by, orders signed by the said commissioners, or any two of them, in favour of the person or persons to whom the same shall have been sold, with the rate and amount of the said sale; and the said commissioners shall make a full and detailed return to the treasurer of the western shore of the said special bank account, at the completion of each and every final drawing of each and every of the said lotteries, and at the same time, in like manner, shall send therewith the cancelled checks, in virtue whereof the tickets sold were withdrawn from the said bank.

"Sec. 4. And be it enacted, That before proceeding to any drawing of any of the said lotteries, the said commissioners shall cover and enclose, under their hands and seals, all the tickets remaining in bank, being the property of the state, and deliver the same to the treasurer of the western shore, or deposit the same, enclosed and sealed as aforesaid, in the branch bank of the United States, or other bank that may have been approved as aforesaid, the said commissioners retaining a list of the numbers of the said tickets, and transmitting a copy of the said list to the said treasurer.

On motion by Mr. Thomas, the following was inserted before the last section:

And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of all the lottery commissioners to reside in the city of Baltimore.

On motion by Mr. Duvall, the question was put, That the same be reconsidered? Determined in the negative.

The bill was then passed and sent to the senate.

The message relative to adjourning on the 11th inst. was read the second time. Mr. Beckett moved to strike out Saturday the 11th inst. to insert "Saturday the 4th inst." Mr. Thomas called for a division of the question, and it was put on striking out? The yeas and nays being required appeared as follow:
