The senate have appointed Messrs. Johnson and Scott, to be, with the gentlemen named by your house, a committee of conference to consider the bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Pennsylvania, Delaware, and Maryland Steam Navigation Company.

Which were read.

The resolution in favour of Theodorick Bland, Esq. and the resolution in favour of Thomas Wright, severally endorsed "assented to." And a bill, entitled, An additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the benefit of the University of Maryland, endorsed "will pass," referred to Messrs. Howard, Hopper and Barrett.

Mr. Boone delivers the following report:

The committee to whom was referred a bill from the senate entitled, An act to confirm the proceedings of certain commissioners in Queen-Anne's county, beg leave to report—That they have had said bill under examination, and are of opinion that it ought to be passed by this house without amendment.

On the second reading of the bill to incorporate a company for the purpose of building a bridge over Susquehanna, at Havre-de-Grace. Mr. Goldsborough moved to postpone the further consideration thereof until to-morrow. Resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Thomas moved to refer it to a committee. Resolved in the affirmative.

The speaker appointed Messrs Hall, Sewell, Thomas, Goldsborough and Howard.

The bill to divorce David H. White, and Ann White, of the city of Baltimore, was read the second time and passed.

The clerk of the senate returns the resolution relative to chancery papers: the resolutions in favour of Joseph Cresap, Conrad Coffroth, John Templeman, and Agnes Tannhill, severally endorsed "assented to." The resolution in favour of John Tilghman and Richard J. Jones, endorsed "assented to with the proposed amendment;" which amendment was assented to. The resolutions in favour of Charles Bryan, James Bryan, and Daniel Smith, severally endorsed "dissented from."

The house adjourns until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.

Saturday, March 4, 1826.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

On motion by Mr. Hall, Messrs. Gilpin and Merrick were added to the committee, on the bill for building a bridge over the river Susquehanna at Havre-de-Grace.

On motion by Mr. Thomas, Messrs. Arnold E. Jones and Bro-hawn were added to the same.

On motion by Mr. Teackle, the following resolution was read:
