

Also the further supplement to an act, entitled, **An act relating to lotteries**, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendment;" which amendment was read, assented to, and sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr. Estep, the following resolution was read, assented to, and sent to the senate:

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to Edward J. Coale, or order, the sum of seventy two dollars and fifty cents, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury, being the amount of his account for six copies of a work on canals, with maps, plates, &c. furnished the legislature at the present session.

The clerk of the senate delivers a communication from the executive, with communications relative to the state's claim against the United State.

The bill for the relief of Margaret Ludden, of the city of Baltimore was passed, and sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr. Merrick, the following message was read, assented to, and sent to the senate.

By the House of Delegates, March 9, 1826.

Gentlemen of the Senate.

We propose, with the concurrence of your honourable body, to close the session this evening, and to invite his excellency the governor to attend in the senate chamber, at 8 o'clock, to sign the laws, agreeably to the constitution and form of government.

We have named Messrs. Merrick and Goldsborough, to wait upon his excellency, in company with such gentlemen as may be named by your honourable body, to communicate the joint invitation of the two houses of assembly.

The resolution in favour of Mrs. Priscilla Smith, and Michael Ellis, was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate returns the bill to make valid the acts of justices of the peace relating to supersedeas; the bill to oblige owners and occupiers of mills, or other water works, to keep bridges over their runs in the several counties of this state, endorsed "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed.

Also the resolution in favour of Ann Baker, and others; the resolution relative to the 9th election district in Baltimore county; the resolutions in favour of Jonas Green, John Clare, and William O'Hara, severally endorsed "assented to."

The bill for the relief of Hannah Bostetter, of Washington county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The bill to divorce Nicholas Heitzelberger, and his wife, of the city of Baltimore, was passed and sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate delivers the resolutions in favour of Priscilla Smith, Michael Ellis, and Edward J. Coale, severally endorsed "assented to." The bill for the relief of Hannah Bostetter, and the bill for the relief of Margaret Ludden, endorsed "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed.
