On motion by Mr. M'Culloh, the following order was read:

Ordered, That any member of the house of delegates, who thinks the present per diem now allowed to the members, too large, have leave to claim and receive only as much as he may think the per diem ought to be. And the question put, That the house assent to the same? Determined in the negative.

Mr. Spencer obtained leave to bring in a bill, to provide for a re-valuation of real and personal property in Talbot county. Ordered, That Messrs. Spencer, Banning and Millis, report the same.

Mr. Thomas reports a bill, entitled, An act to withdraw the donation from the West Nottingham and Elkton academies, in Cecil county, and for other purposes.

Mr. Gilpin presents a petition from John N. Black, of Cecil county, praying that a compensation may be provided by law for the brigade inspectors of the Maryland militia; referred to the committee on the militia.

The clerk of the senate returns the resolution in favour of Literary Institutions, endorsed "assented to." The bill for the relief of the executors, in Maryland, of William Murdock, of London, deceased, endorsed "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed. And a bill, entitled, An act authorising the mayor and city council of Baltimore, to appoint wood-corders for said city, endorsed "will pass;" which was read.

The speaker laid before the house a report from the treasurer of the western shore, in compliance with the order proposed by Mr. Speed; referred to Messrs. Speed, Gantt and Willson.

Mr. Garner reports a bill, entitled, An act to alter and change the names of John A. Johnson, Hezekiah Johnson, Zackra Johnson, Uriah Johnson and Catharine Johnson, to John A. Bowie, Hezekiah Bowie, Zackra Bowie, Uriah Bowie and Catharine Bowie.

Mr. Grubb reports a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of the stockholders of the Susquehannah bridge.

The bill to authorise aliens to purchase and hold real property within this state, was read the second time.

Mr. Spencer moved the following as the 4th section: "And be it enacted, That if any alien or aliens shall, after having acquired any right, title, or interest of, in or to, any lands, tenements or hereditaments, as provided in the first section of this law, sell, convey, or dispose of the same, before he she or they shall have become naturalized as aforesaid, and shall, after such sale, conveyance or disposition, refuse
