

The bill to regulate the meetings of the trustees of the poor of Dorchester county, was read the second time by special order, passed, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Barnes reports a bill, entitled, An act to authorise the orphans courts of this state to order the sale of real estates in certain cases.

Mr. Cockey obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled, An act requiring registers of wills to record powers of attorney in certain cases, and making a certified copy of such record evidence. Ordered, That Messrs. Cockey, Worthington and Barnes, report the same.

The bill to change the name of Walker Bennet Dickerson, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr. Tyson, Ordered, That the bill relative to the appointment of wood corders in the city of Baltimore, have a second reading on to-morrow.

The bill to incorporate the Lafayette Beneficial Society of Baltimore, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Barnes reports a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Barbara Wagers, William Lowe, John Clary and Richard Howard, of Frederick county.

On motion by Mr. Barnes, the following resolution was twice read by special order, and dissented from.

By the House of Delegates, Jan. 12, 1826.

Resolved, That the governor and council be and they are hereby authorised and required, to pay to Henry Zimmerman, (of Benjamin,) of Frederick county, the amount of such expense as has been or may be incurred in repairing seventy-five muskets, the property of the state, in the use of the company commanded by the said Henry Zimmerman; provided that the said Henry Zimmerman shall produce to the governor and council vouchers for all payments on account of such repairs made as aforesaid; and provided also, that the whole expense of such repairs shall not exceed the sum of thirty dollars.

The bill to confirm an act to abolish so much of the constitution and form of government as relates to the oath to be taken by the senators and delegates previous to the election of governor and council, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate returns the supplement to the act, entitled, An additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act to regulate public ferries, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendment;" which amendment was read.

Mr. Farquhar obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled, A further additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act to establish the line between Frederick and Washington counties, passed at November session 1810, chapter 6. Ordered, That Messrs. Farquhar, Cockey and Barnes, report the same.

The order relative to the Washington Monument Lottery, was read the second time and assented to.

Mr. Barnes presents a petition from the free school society of Frederick, praying for a portion of the school fund of Frederick county; referred to Messrs. Barnes, Sappington and Cockey.

Mr. Cockey obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to confirm an act, entitled, An act to repeal all such parts of the constitution as relates to the division of Frederick county into eleven election districts, and for other purposes. Ordered, That Messrs. Cockey, Farquhar and Barnes, report the same.
