Mr. Potter delivers the following report:

The committee to whom was referred the petition of Joseph Richardson, clerk of Caroline county court, report, that they have had the same under their consideration, and are of opinion that the prayer of the said petition is reasonable, and do therefore recommend the adoption of the following resolution:

Resolved, That the time now allowed by law, to the several clerks and registers in the state to make up their records, be extended to the first day of January eighteen hundred and twenty-seven, so far as the same respects the clerk of Caroline county court.

Mr. Gantt obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to protect the fisheries in the rivers and waters of Anne-Arundel county. Ordered, That Messrs. Gantt, Linthicum and Estep, report the same.

Mr. Barnes obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled, An act relating to the duties of justices of the peace and constables. Ordered, That Messrs. Barnes, Cockey and Sappington, report the same.

The bill for the revaluation of real and personal property in Talbot county, and the supplement to the act to introduce wholesome water into the city of Frederick, were severally read and passed.

The bill to appropriate a part of the school fund belonging to Frederick county to the purposes therein mentioned, was read the second time, and recommitted.

On motion by Mr. Howard, the following order was read and assented to:

Ordered, That the committee be instructed to inquire into the expediency of directing the levy court to distribute annually the amount received from the treasurer, for the purpose of promoting education.
