One thousand Seven hundred and twenty six came againe as well the s<sup>d</sup> John Gale his Lordships attorney who for his said Lordship in this behalf prosecuteth, as the said John Caldwell J<sup>r</sup> by his attorney s<sup>d</sup>, and the same John Gale his Lordships attorney who as well s<sup>d</sup> says he will not further prosecute the s<sup>d</sup> John Caldwell in s<sup>d</sup> Complaint s<sup>d</sup>. Wherefore it is considered by the Justices here that the s<sup>d</sup> John Caldwell J<sup>r</sup> of the Complaint s<sup>d</sup> be acquitted &c
