The following order was read and adopted:

Ordered, that Mr. Andrew Slicer be appointed Messenger, and Mr. Samuel Peaco Door Keeper to the Senate.

They severally qualified as such.

Mr. Goldshorough submitted the following message, Which was read and adopted:
