TUESDAY, February 7th, 1837.

The House met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The message adopted by the house on yesterday, in relation to the appointment of register of wills for Carroll county, was sent to the Senate.

The Speaker laid before the house a report of the register of wills of Prince George's county, in obedience to the order of the House of Delegates of the 26th ultimo;

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Mr. Tuck presented a petition of sundry citizens of Prince George's county, praying for the passage of such laws as may ameliorate the condition of the tobacco market;

Which was read, and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Brengle presented a petition of Mary Moore, widow of John Moore, a soldier of the revolution, praying to be placed on the pension roll;

Which was read and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Mr. Brengle also presented a petition of sundry citizens of Buckey's Town election district, in Frederick county, praying that no act may be passed to divide said election district;

Which was read, and referred to the select committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Buchanan presented two memorials of sundry citizens of Allegany county, counter to the recommendations set forth in the report of the Superintendent of the National road;
